#### **STEM Committee**

The STEM (Staff Training for Effective Management) Committee is working to "Reach New Horizons" with a few exciting updates for the STEM program! Keep watching the TESA website (www.tesatexas.org) for announcements about new technology classes. This is the time of year when renewing your CEOP (Certified Educational Office Professional) distinction is beginning to come to mind. There are a few steps to keep in mind so you receive your letter from Sharon Mena, TESA President 2021-2022, without delay.

#### **Step-by-step Re-certification Process:**

- 1. Complete a total of 6 hours of continuous training in increments of 3 hours or more. (Each certificate must show a minimum of three hours each and dated between **August 1** and **July 31**.)
- 2. Fill out the Re-certification Form can be found at <u>www.tesatexas.org</u> under STEM program.
- 3. Attach copies of your certificates for the total of 6 hours to the re-certification form.
- 4. Attach a copy of your current membership card or copy of cashed check for membership dues paid.
- 5. Submit via email to: <a href="mailto:info@tesatexas.org">info@tesatexas.org</a> for the quick process OR mail to: TESA, PO BOX 11825, Killeen TX 76547
- 6. Once ALL information is received then the President will email you a recertification letter.

Please allow 8- 10 days for processing once received.

- "Kids Game Basket" theme filled with books, games, color books, crayons, that would brighten a child's day










