The guy that cut the rope from her mouth said her eye followed him the whole time, and he will never be the same again.

May we all be so fortunate to be surrounded by people who will help us get untangled from the things of life that weigh us down, and may we always know the joy of giving and helping others. How long has it been since we have truly helped someone who needs it so desperately, without them having to ask for help?

Each morning I pray for all the TESA members. I ask God to give us all guidance and understanding, that we will be a shining light for someone else each day. Please keep each other daily in your thoughts and prayers. I tell you...I need your prayers each day. I love you all and want you to know I am so honored to serve with you this year.


swered, and the paperwork gets filed where it needs to go for future reference.

Staff Training for Effective Management



Staff Training for Effective Management (STEM)

TESA Members,

In an effort to meet the needs of a majority of our members, changes approved to the STEM program regarding the number of hours for the choice and self-directed study requirements became effective August 1, 2015.

The choice session requirements were increased to 12 hours and the self -directed study hours were reduced to 15 hours. There were no changes to the required course section.

We understand this new structure could affect members mid-way through the process of earning their CEOP certification. The president and STEM Committee agreed to use this rule of thumb for those members affected by the new structure, which is:

- Members who have earned 30 clock hours or more can choose to continue following the previous plan.
- Members who have earned 30 clock hours or less will follow the new plan with the required courses, 12 hours from the choice section and 15 hours of self-directed study.

There are always unique situations that occur when making this type of program structure change. The president and STEM chairman will review extenuating circumstances on a case-by-case basis.

We appreciate your continued support of the STEM program, and please do not hesitate to contact us should you have any questions or concerns.



BESSA Installs New Officers for 2015-16 School Year




What does cereal have to do with an installation of officers? That's what the attendees at the Birdville Educational Support Staff Association (BESSA) found out on April 16, 2015.
