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A Year In The Life Of a TESA President

So many decisions...looking back, they started small with my theme and logo...then selecting committee members to work with elected board members. Then, "Ok, I can do this." So I share my goals with the fifteen executive board members...and then it is time to prepare the budget...a budget with money which belongs to 1000-plus-+ individuals. What a responsibility, but I am not alone.

This budget represents every heartbeat of TESA...STEM classes, conferences, Consultant Training, affiliates, publishing four magazine issues; supporting the central office expenditures and Administrative Assistant. As TESA President, you feel each heartbeat, and I am not alone.

It was bittersweet to plan the last Fall Work Conference in 2011. Our members were treated to an incredible finale to celebrate this memorable occasion complete with a sing-along movie night, dynamic speakers, ice cream sundaes and a panoramic photo shoot. I was not alone.

The fall brought STEM class cancellations and the need to provide the bi-annual Consultant Training in the spring. Our STEM consultants attended an upgraded Consultant Training in half the time, which was a huge success, and again, I was not alone.

Planning for the 2012 SWC involves the entire year. There were two site visits to the Omni in San Antonio in addition to the many challenges associated with a new hotel

and city and "guesstimating" the number of attendees. More decisions... The hotel room block is full and we have members who need rooms; NAEOP President as our guest at SWC; menus to select for the three plated events, AV needs for sessions and events. Still, I am not alone.

There have been four issues of The TESA Connection with committee ads and affiliate articles in addition to the special feature articles. I am never alone.

It has been a real treat to work with President Elect Pat Crawford. We became attached at the hip in April 2011 and it will be a painful separation as we depart NAEOP in July. We have truly been connected on one surfboard, steering TESA through the calmer waters and hanging ten when the Waves of Diversity caused the ocean to be a bit more challenging. Pat was always on the other end of the email, text or phone call. I was never alone.

The responsibility always reminds me ... Is this the right decision, one that will be in the best interest of TESA and its members? The Executive Board has worked this year to provide the benefits and events our members have come to expect. Each Affiliate has supported our efforts by attending STEM classes and conferences. We have not been alone.

The TESA Central Office Administrative Assistant serves the executive board and members and has been a tremendous asset to me. We are not alone.

Several years ago the TESA executive boards made a commitment to explore ways to save money for TESA. The steps that Pat and I would like to share are:

- Selecting committee members in close proximity to reduce travel expenses
- Negotiating the conference hotel contracts to include lowering room blocks and Food & Beverage amounts, thus reducing TESA's overhead at SWC
- Discontinuing FWC by vote of the Board and membership, which will realize significant savings for 2012-2013
- Eliminating the need for board members to travel by holding the 2012 Spring Board meeting via conference call
- Streamlining Consultant Training (CT) from three to one and one-half days, reducing the overall expenses to TESA and consultants....CT had already been cut to every other year (decided in 2009 Consultant Training) so these combined reductions have been efficient and costeffective
- Carpooling of Board members even more to cut travel expenses
- Holding 2012-2013 Board Orientation during SWC to reduce travel/hotel expenses for 2012-2013
- Relocating the TESA office from downtown Austin to Cedar Park, saving on office rent and the need to rent a PO Box
- Communicating with members via email blasts to save on printing and postage expenses

As President, all these decisions must be made accepting responsibility alone – but never being alone. There were board members, past presidents, special committees, standing committees, exceptionally late night meetings – because by design, the TESA President was never meant to be alone.


Lorene Roby Rogers Scholarship

from San Jacinto College and UHCL.





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
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
